Responsibilities:

You will work within an interdisciplinary ERC project which focuses on an archaeological research concession in northern Sudan (Munich University Attab to Ferka Survey Project, see https://www.sudansurvey.gwi.uni-muenchen.de/). The project DiverseNile aims to reconstruct ancient life cycles and biographies of landscape and peoples in Bronze Age Middle Nile following a multidisciplinary approach, focusing on settlements, cemeteries, material culture, environmental remains and landscape.

You will be responsible for **Work package 2: The variability of funerary monuments in the Attab to Ferka region.** A new assessment of the funerary sites within the research area based on published data and selected new excavation will be conducted. The variability of the tomb architecture attested as simple pit graves, more elaborate Egyptian-style tombs and Nubian-style tumuli will be studied in detail, considering fine dating and combined with the assessment of the material culture. You will work under the guidance of the project leader Julia Budka. The five years 100% position will enable you to excavate, document and publish the sites as an independent monograph for the ERC project.

Requirements:

In order to qualify for application, candidates must have completed their doctorate in the field of Egyptology, Sudan or Egyptian archaeology or a related archaeological field with outstanding results. They have to demonstrate their openness towards working in an interdisciplinary context as well as an interest in basic and theoretical questions. You should be an archaeologist with past field experience excavating cemeteries and analysing funerary remains, preferably in Northeast Africa.
